Getting Started

Review the Course Information Sheet and <u>The Planning Guide for Students and Parents</u>, 2017-2018. Course descriptions can be found in the guide. The Planning Guide is also available online.

- Teachers will make recommendations for the next school year in PowerSchool (all academic classes).
- Parents will be required to create a login using their student's ID number (similar to ZippSlip) to access the parent portal in PowerSchool.
- Once successfully logged into PowerSchool, parents will be expected to accept the recommended courses (Math, English, Science, & Social Studies) and choose 3 elective courses through the parent portal.
- Directions for accessing the parent portal are attached to this packet. A video and handout will be placed in Tech Tips for easy access.

Important Dates (please check the school's website as dates are subject to change without notice)

- January 22nd to 27th Teachers will make recommendations for English, Math, Science, and Social Studies classes through PowerSchool.
- February 6th 4:00 to 7:00 Parent/Teacher conferences at Brookland MS
- February 5th to 9th Parents accept teacher recommendations and select electives online.
- June 15th Deadline to request a schedule change.

First Things First

Please consider the following in preparing your schedule:

- Current academic performance
- Academic ability
- Level of interest
- Out-of-school commitments; time management skills
- Advanced/Accelerated courses are based on the following guidelines, with the exception of math:
 - o An "A" or "B" in academic performance, in the current year;
 - A score of 75th percentile or higher on a recent national standardized test;
 - Teacher recommendations based on your desire to be challenged academically, ability to adjust easily to change, ability to think and verbalize critically;
 - Specific work characteristics are displayed wherein you demonstrate the ability to problem solve, grasp complex concepts, work independently, write independently, be self-directed and read for pleasure.

<u>Understanding Instructional Coding</u> Some course numbers are followed by a letter (ex. 1109V). The letters are used to designate the following:

I – Collaborative classes (used for students with IEP's) X – ESL level 2
E – Self-contained classes (used for students with IEP's) Y – ESL level 3
C – College Prep/Regular Z – ESL level 4

A – Advanced/Honors G – First semester

H – Second semester

Course Request Selection through Parent Portal

- 1. Log into the Parent Portal website at https://sis.henrico.k12.va.us/public
- On the Parent Sign In page, enter your Username and Password. Click Sign In.
- Click on the Class Registration icon in the Navigation section on the left. *NOTE: The Class Registration icon will not appear until the designated day set for the beginning of the course selection process.




4. Check the top of the screen to make sure that the correct school name appears. For Rising 6th and 9th grade students, this should be the name of their new middle or high school. All other students should see their current school. If the Class Registration icon does not appear or the school name is incorrect, contact your student's School Counseling Department.

5. The class registration screen will be displayed on this page. Listed on the left side of the screen will be course subject areas. Example: English, Math, Science, etc. On the right, you will see a pencil icon. Be sure to read any directions or notes listed with each subject area to ensure you are making selections correctly. To make a course selection, click on the pencil icon opposite the subject area. In some circumstances, a course (such as PE below) may have been pre-selected for your student.



6. Clicking on a pencil icon opens a window showing possible course selections. Core courses (English, Math, Science, etc), as well as some electives, require a teacher recommendation in order to be selected. The name of the teacher that made the course recommendation for your student will be displayed on the right. Select the desired course by-clicking in the box to the left. Courses that have no check box cannot be selected.




You may select up to 1 course. You have selected 0 courses.



7. Be sure to click **Okay** at the bottom right when your selection has been made. You may have to scroll down in order to see the **Okay** button. **NOTE**: Some screens, such as electives, may require you to scroll to "next" to see all course selection options available to you. Some screens may also require you to choose more than one subject if two elective choices are available or you are picking two semester courses.

8. When you have completed all course selections, your page will show a "box" on each subject line for which you have selected a class. In some cases, you may be required to make multiple selections in a subject area. This will cause multiple "boxes" to appear on the screen and could cause confusion about which "pencil" icon to click. Place your cursor over a pencil icon, and a window will appear showing the subject area to which that "pencil" is attached.



9. After clicking Submit, you will get a message that says "Changes Recorded". To view a list of your requests, click on the Class Registration icon on the left. This will open your course screen again. At the top of the course screen click on the link that says "View course requests". A list of requests will appear. You may print this page by clicking on the print icon located on the far right end of the Navigation bar.

2018 Summer Online Health and Physical Education Courses



Thank you for your interest in summer online health and physical education.

As many of you know, summer Online Health and PE has become a popular program for our students. Due to limited resources needed for this type of online course, we must cap the enrollment at 500 students. Priority will be given to rising eleventh- and twelfth-grade students to ensure they have the credits necessary for graduation. Rising ninth- and tenth-grade students will be eligible for a lottery for the remaining slots. Students not selected in the lottery should be prepared to take the course in regular summer school, during the school year or online during another summer. The courses are open to students who will be enrolled in Henrico County Public Schools and to HCPS students enrolled at Maggie Walker Governor's School during school year 2018-19.

All students – including juniors and seniors – who wish to be considered for Online Health and PErmust sign-up for the lottery. If you are seriously interested in taking this class, please fill out and submit the Online Health and PE lottery form (http://tinyurl.com/onlinehpe2018) (once per child). You may verify that you are signed up for the lottery by looking for your name on the lottery list (http://tinyurl.com/hpelotteryconfirmation2018).

Parents may sign up for the 2018 lottery beginning February 8 at approximately 7 a.m. Sign-ups will conclude March 2 at 4 p.m. Everyone who signs up for the lottery will be contacted by email the week of March 5th to let them know if they were selected or not for the summer 2018 Online Health and Physical Education class. All correspondence will be through email, so it is very important that email addresses be correct.

If selected, parents will need to go to their home school counseling office to register and pay for the class sometime from March 12-23 at 4 p.m. If students are not selected through the lottery, they will **not** be able to register in the counseling office. Registration is not complete until forms and payment are received in the student's home-school counseling office.

Variance Procedures

- 1. If a student is scheduled to attend J.R. Tucker high school, all they have to do is sign up for Military Science I through your normal process.
- 2. If a student is assigned to attend a high school other than J.R. Tucker, they will need to have their parent/guardian contact LtCol Reiffer (bcreiffer@henrico.k12.va.us) or Sgt. Maj. Cauley (rscauley@henrico.k12.va.us) at 804-527-4679 to set up an appointment to meet to discuss J.R. Tucker's Marine Corps JROTC Program.
- 3. Once the meeting has taken place, the parent/guardian will need to go to this website, http://tuckerjrotc.weebly.com/forms.html to print off a variance form. The completed form will need to be delivered to the high school they are assigned to attend for the principal's endorsement.
- 4. SgtMaj Cauley and LtCol Reiffer will request the student's grades and attendance and discipline records to help determine whether the student should be enrolled as a cadet in J.R. Tucker's Marine Corps JROTC program.
- 5. Once the variance form is signed by the assigned high school's principal, it then should be sent to J.R. Tucker High School so the J.R. Tucker principal can endorse it.
